SECTIONS – Judging Commences at 10.00am

Some of the Sections may be split into classes to divide the entries into approximately equal numbers appropriate for the size of the show ring thereby allowing all animals to be shown to the best advantage.

SECTION 1**Three Year Old Heifers**

01/01/2014 - 31/12/2014

SECTION 2**Two Year Old Heifers**

01/01/2015 - 31/12/2015

SECTION 3**Yearling Heifers**

01/01/2016 – 31/12/2016

SECTION 4**Heifer Calves**

Born on or after 01/01/2017 and before 31/03/2017

SECTION 5**Three Year Old Heifer with Calf at Foot**

01/01/2014 - 31/12/2014

SECTION 6**Cows and Senior Heifers**

Born on or before 31/12/2013

PLEASE NOTE: All females born on before 31 December 2014 must be scanned, Pd'd or stated on the entry form as 'in calf' or with calf at foot. Written confirmation must be received by 30 September

Judging of the Young Handlers Class – this class may be split**Judging of the Overall Female Champion and the Reserve Overall Female Champion**

The Overall Female Champion will be selected from the first prize winners from section 1,2,3,4,5 & 6. The Reserve Overall Female Champion will be selected from the remainder of the first prizes winners and the female that stood second to the Overall Female Champion in the Section Class. Second Prize winners should therefore be on standby.

Judging of the Best Pair of Suckled Heifer Calves Bred by Exhibitor**Judging of the Best Pair of in-calf Heifers****SECTION 7****Males**

If there are more than 3 entries forward for each male section the classes will be judged. Yearling bulls under the age of 14 months must be notified with the Society. Purchasers please note these males must be vet checked and DNA'd at 14 months of age if you intend using them as breeding bulls. Failure to do this will result in the progeny being ineligible for registration. Male animals will be sold through the sale ring following the female sale. There is a maximum age limit of 7 years old for bulls.

SECTION 8**Unhalted Section**

The entries will be judged in the pens.
